


The main beneficiaries of our education system are learners (students). The outcome of the learning process highly depends on the satisfaction level of the learners. It is prime duty of every institute to collect feedback on the satisfaction level of learners, analyze it and if needed, accordingly design and implement new policies and schemes or modify existing ones.

In our college, we adopted the format of questionnaire designed by the NAAC to the satisfaction level of students. The format containing 20 questions on five-point Lickert's scale and also few regarding personal information of students is designed. Due to Covid-19 pandemic, college was closed during the end of academic year. Therefore, the questionnaire communicated to the students as a "Google Form" through whatsapp and Telegram groups created.


We received 315 responses. Approximately, 20 % students responded and recorded their responses. Among the responses, the proportion of girls are three times higher than that of boys, whereas the science and commerce faculty students are seen to be more aware regarding survey as compared to other faculties. The majority of the responses of students regarding the teaching, communication of teachers, extent of syllabus covered, preparation of teachers for the classes are reported as 'excellent' or 'satisfactory'. The responses regarding the use of ICT for teaching and learning, opportunities for extra-curricular activities are excellent. The student centric teaching methods such participative and experimental learning and problem solving methodologies are highly appreciated by the students, which is reflected in the responses. Approximately, 85 % of students feel that overall teaching-learning process is very good in our college.



Feedback responses of Girl students are observed to be three times more than that of boy students.






When we analyzed feedback according to the class, we observed that response of senior students is much higher than first and second year students.

More than 60 % of students (respondents) responded that 80 % and more syllabuses were covered in the class. 80 % respondents reported that 70% and more syllabuses were covered in the class. However, 4% of respondents reported that even less than 30% of syllabus was covered in the class. This is to be investigated for reasons of failure and necessary steps should be taken.




Students' responses regarding the preparation of teachers for the classes are altogether <u>satisfactory</u>. We should think that only 23 % of responses reported that teachers prepare thoroughly for the classes.

60 % of respondents have reported that teachers are always effective to communicate with students in classes. However, other responses are also considerable, so there may be some teachers whose communication is up to the satisfaction of the students.

Approximately, 75% of students have reported that teachers approach to teaching is very good or excellent. There is not a single response reported poor approach of teacher to teaching.


More than 80 % of the respondents have reported that internal evaluation processes by the teacher are 'Always Fair' or 'Usually Fair'.



Majority of the students (respondents) have reported that their teachers were discussed their performance in the assignments.

Approximately, 82 % of students have reported the response 'satisfactory' or 'very well' regarding mentoring process in the college.


9. The institution (college) provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow 314 responses




About 85 % of Students are strongly agreed or agreed with the multiple opportunities provided to learn and grow in the college.

10. Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes


